HUMAN RIGHTS BASED APPROACH TO BIODIVERSITY IN THE KUNING MONTREAL GLOBAL BIODIVERSITY FRAMEWORK

Key concepts:

Duty-bearers: States, but also business. They hold specific duties under international law

Rights-holders: All individuals or social groups that have particular entitlements in relation to a duty-bearer. All human beings are rights-holders under the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.

Procedural Rights: access to information, right to participation in processes, and to access to justice, including the protection of environmental and human rights defenders.

Substantive Rights: The underlying entitlement to services or conditions of a good life, such as rights to education, health services, property, decent work, and the right to a clean healthy and sustainable environment, including rich biodiversity
