OPENING STATEMENTS

Astrid Schomaker, Executive Secretary of the Secretariat of the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) gave the opening speech.

PANEL IV

Panel IV addressed the new programme of work and institutional arrangements on Article 8(j) and other provisions of the Convention related to Indigenous Peoples and local communities. The panel focused on knowledge, culture, and the full and effective participation of Indigenous Peoples and local communities (Elements 4 and 6).

The panel was moderated by Christine Grant, Co-chair of the International Indigenous Peoples' Forum on World Heritage. Peter Bates (UNESCO), Edith Bastidas (Indigenous Women Biodiversity Network of Latin America and Caribbean Region -RMIB-LAC), Jaime Luis Arias Ramirez (Consejo Territorial de Cabildos – CTC) and Alejandra Loria, delegate of the Costa Rica Government were panelists.

Panel IV was followed by a dialogue with the participants.

PANEL V

The fifth panel addressed the strengthening implementation and monitoring progress, and a human rights-based approach (Elements 5 and 7).

The panel was moderated by Pernilla Malmer, Stockholm Resilience Centre, Stockholm University. Panelists were Xilonem Clarke, Forest Peoples Programme - FPP, Abigail Aoas Kitma, Indigenous Peoples' International Centre for Policy Research and Education - Tebtebba, Giovanni Reyes, Indigenous Peoples Advisory Group (IPAG), Global Environment Facility (GEF) and Camilo Niño, Technical Secretary of the Comisión Nacional de Territorios Indígenas (CNTI).
