Establishment of the Subsidiary Body on Article 8(j) and Other Provisions – SB8J



- COP 16 established the Subsidiary Body on Article 8(j) and other provisions of the Convention on Biological Diversity relating to indigenous peoples and local communities (SB8J) by decision 16/5.
- SB8J is mandated to provide advice to the COP, other subsidiary bodies and, subject to request, COP-MOP-CP and COP-MOP-NP, on matters of interest to indigenous peoples and local communities that fall within the scope of the CBD and its Protocols.
- The SB8J is tasked with developing and finalizing its modus operandi at its first meeting (decision 16/5).
- This topic appears as item 4 on the SB8J-1 work agenda.

- COP 16 adopted the Programme of Work on Article 8(j) up to 2030 (decision 16/4).
- Task 6.1 calls for "implementing and further developing the enhanced participation mechanisms used by the Working Group on Article 8(j) and Related Provisions of the Convention".

Aspects that the SB8J must consider when developing its modus operandi:

- 1. Full and effective participation of the PlyLC
- 2. Cost efficiency compared to the GT8J
- 3. Recognition of SB8J as a Party-led process
